## **Child Spirit Seeing and Child Spirit Dreaming**

"As a First Nations doctor and Mother to a child with autism we view and see our children in a way of their spirit and being, they are not defined by a diagnosis. Our Gangulu and South Sea cultural connections acknowledge that the health and broader life ecosystems transition through unpredictable yet recurring cycles of growth and creation.

The Gangulu have an evolving knowledge network acquired by ancestors over hundreds of thousands of years – time immemorial through direct contact with the environment, land and waters. This knowledge is specific to our homelands – Gangulu country – and includes the relationships between plants, animals, traditional medicines, natural phenomena, landscapes and timing of events that are used for lifeways.

The Gangulu people, our homeland, our spirit dreaming and the environment are an interconnected framework that envelops our children in care and centredness – we are one organism. Intergenerational knowledge and connection to our homelands, spiritual, physical, emotional and community wellbeing helps us to identify and redefine challenges for our children, with interwoven solutions within a cultural framework of healing and acceptance of 'child spirit seeing' and 'child seeing dreaming.' The Gangulu consider our children to be the centre of our spiritual and cultural ecosystem and all things focus on their spiritual, physical, psychosocial and dreaming wellbeing."
